### **VIRGINIA APPRENTICESHIP COUNCIL RECOGNIZES OUTSTANDING APPRENTICES FOR 2002**

**RICHMOND** – The Virginia Department of Labor and Industry announced that the Virginia Apprenticeship Council has recognized four apprentices as Virginia's Outstanding Apprentices for 2002. The Council, in association with the Virginia Department of Labor and Industry, sponsors the awards program, which honors outstanding apprentices each year who have completed their training programs and are nominated by their sponsoring organizations. Nominated apprentices are judged in many areas, including craftsmanship, accuracy, cooperation, leadership, decision-making, and consideration for their companies and co-workers.

Barry W. Baker, Chairman of the Virginia Apprenticeship Council, accompanied by Secretary of Commerce and Trade Michael J. Schewel and Commissioner of Labor and Industry C. Ray Davenport, presented the Outstanding Apprentice Awards at a ceremony on December 19, 2002 to the following persons:
