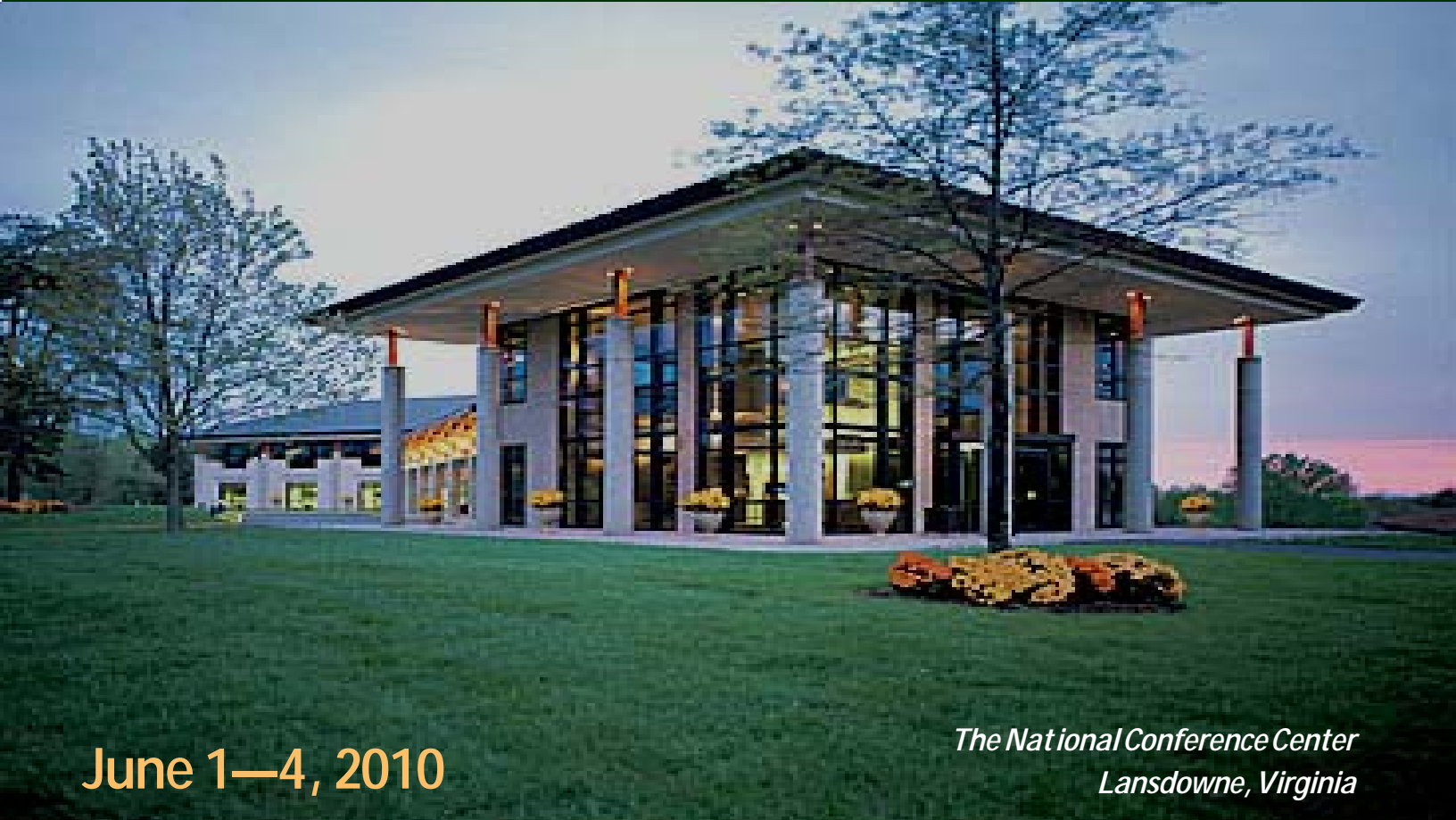

RECORDABILITY: YOU MAKE THE CALL

Wondering whether an injury case is really recordable? Do you ever wonder where the line is between triggering the recordability criteria and not recording? Come test your knowledge of the standard in a fun and interactive session where you get to electronically vote, make the call, and compare your answers with that of your peers. Each scenario invokes a thought provoking discussion of the regulatory behind the general consensus of industry experts. "And the survey says...."

VOSH REGULATORY UPDATE:

This discussion will cover the Reverse Signal Operation Safety Requirements, 16VAC25-97, as they relate to all construction and general industry vehicles, machinery or equipment capable of operating in reverse and with an "obstructed view to the rear."

NEW DIRECTIONS IN CRANE SAFETY: THE NEW OSHA CRANE STANDARD

The new standard may still be in the proposed stage, or may have already been published by the date of this presentation. This very fast paced hour will be an overview of the new rules, with some details and expansion into key areas. Brief mention of important differences in crane rules of surrounding states will be included.

ROOT CAUSE ANALYSIS (RCA): BACK TO BASICS

This presentation will discuss the importance of using a standardized process to investigate employee injuries. Root Cause Analysis (RCA) is a method of 'drilling down' to investigate all of the possible adverse events in order to identify system flaws that may not be immediately apparent at initial review.
